Then Peter called to him, "Lord, if it's really you, tell me to come to you, walking on the water."

Connect: In your small group, take 5 to 7 mins to connect. Below are a few questions to guide your discussion.

- What is something you have had high standards for, or wanted to be perfect? Perhaps your wedding, a graduation, or a project?
- On a more personal note, what is a fear you have had before starting something new, going somewhere new, or taking a step of faith?

Read: In your small group, read and reflect on the following passages. See reflection questions below.

Philippians 1:6

Being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.

Romans 8:28

And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.

1 Corinthians 15:58

Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain.

Reflect:

- How do these verses free us from the constant pursuit of perfection?
- What is the truth that we learn about God in these verses?
- How can these verses encourage us in the situations we are in, even if our story is not finished yet?

Pray: Pray that God would help us to rest in the work He did on the cross, knowing that our stories don't have to be perfect before we begin to share our faith. Also pray for opportunities to share our faith with those in our circles of influence. Pray for a new boldness to step into the places God is calling us to.
