Connect: In your small group, take 5 to 7 mins to connect. Below are a few questions to guide your discussion.

- Growing up, who was your favorite superhero and why?
- On a light-hearted level, what is one superhero power you would love to have?
- On a more serious note, what is one way you would like to make a difference in the world?

Read: In your small group, read and reflect on the following passages. See reflection questions below.

Peter 4:10-11

10 Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms. **11** If anyone speaks, they should do so as one who speaks the very words of God. If anyone serves, they should do so with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ. To him be the glory and the power for ever and ever. Amen.

Reflect:

- What does this passage teach us about our role in serving God and others?
- What is a gift or personality trait you have that God could use to share His love with others?

Ephesians 2:1-10

As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins, **2** in which you used to live when you followed the ways of this world and of the ruler of the kingdom of the air, the spirit who is now at work in those who are disobedient. **3** All of us also lived among them at one time, gratifying the cravings of our flesh and following its desires and thoughts. Like the rest, we were by nature deserving of wrath. **4** But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, **5** made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved. **6** And God raised us up with Christ and seated us with him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus, **7** in order that in the coming ages he might show the incomparable riches of his grace, expressed in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. **8** For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— **9** not by works, so that no one can boast. **10** For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

Reflect:

- What does this passage teach us about God?
- How does this passage encourage us to not silence our stories?
- How have you experienced God's grace in your life?
- How would our world look different if each and every one of us played our part, and discovered our next step in sharing our story?

Pray: Pray for one another, asking God for ideas of how to play our part in our communities, and opportunities to show His love to others in small ways throughout the week.
