Discussion Questions

1. How does recognizing every human as made in the image of God shape your view on violence, justice, or punishment? Consider how Genesis 1 and Psalm 139 emphasize the sacredness of human life. How might this understanding influence your thoughts on current issues like abortion, war, or the death penalty?
2. Where do you see the line between defending life and taking life? How do you personally discern when taking a life may be morally justifiable?
3. Matthew 5 teaches that harboring anger or speaking with contempt is spiritually dangerous. What kinds of anger or contempt live in your heart that Jesus might be calling you to confront? Are there relationships or situations where you need healing, forgiveness, or repentance?
4. Reflect on how Jesus redirects the command "do not murder" to address our attitudes and motivations. In what ways is God inviting you to pursue a heart that honors life—not just with your actions, but with your inner life? In what ways as Christians can we preserve, protect, and promote life, i.e., human flourishing?
