Session 2 | Always Fly Solo (Connect in Community)

Connect: In your small group, take 5 to 7 mins to connect. Below are a few questions to guide your discussion.

- What is your favorite team sport and who do you root for?
- If you've ever played sports, what have you loved about being a part of a team?

Read: In your small group, read and reflect on the following passages. See reflection questions below.

1 Corinthians 12:14-27

14 Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many. 15 Now if the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. 16 And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. 17 If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be? If the whole body were an ear, where would the sense of smell be? 18 But in fact God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be. 19 If they were all one part, where would the body be? 20 As it is, there are many parts, but one body. 21 The eye cannot say to the hand, "I don't need you!" And the head cannot say to the feet, "I don't need you!" 22 On the contrary, those parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, 23 and the parts that we think are less honorable we treat with special honor. And the parts that are unpresentable are treated with special modesty, 24 while our presentable parts need no special treatment. But God has put the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other. 26 If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it. 27 Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it.

Reflect:

- What does this passage teach us about the church community, the Body of Christ?
- What does this passage teach us about God Himself?
- What is a gift you have, however small, that could benefit others and perhaps the church?
- How does trying to "go it alone" in our Christian walk contrast with this passage?
- What is the danger if one part of the body doesn't see its value? What is at risk if one part of the body does not think its position or function is important?

Pray: Pray for unity in our church, and that God would show each of us how to use our gifts to serve others in community with others. Pray for us to discover the value of each of our gifts, talents, and positions. Pray for God to show us how we can connect more in community.
